



Student Attainment of Course Credit

To earn credit in **yearlong** courses, the student will fulfill **ALL** of the following criteria:

1. Pass a minimum of two of the three grading “opportunities” each semester. In the first semester, those opportunities are the first quarter, second quarter, and midterm exam. Second semester opportunities are third quarter, fourth quarter, and final examination.
2. Earn an average of .42 quality points (a sample calculation is available on the school’s website).
3. Maintain compliance with the Board approved Attendance Policy (i.e. students exceeding 26 absences may be withdrawn failing from a course).

Students not meeting criteria needed to pass yearlong class will be required to meet with parents, administrator, counselor, and the subject area teacher to determine the appropriate course of action for earning credit. Final discretion will be up to the Principal.

To earn credit in semester courses, the student will fulfill all of the following criteria:

1. Earn a minimum of .42 quality points.
2. Pass a minimum of two of the three grading opportunities in the semester.
3. Maintain daily/class attendance as outlined by Rocky River Board of Education (i.e. students exceeding 13 absences may be withdrawn from the course).

Students not meeting criteria needed to pass a semester class will be required to meet with parents, administrator, counselor, and subject area teacher to determine appropriate course of action for earning credit. Final discretion will be up to the Principal.
