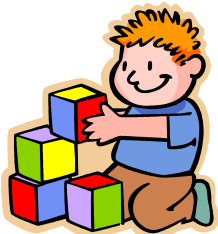

A SEARCH FOR ALL
CHILDREN
WITH DISABILITIES
(AGES 3 yrs. – 21 yrs.)

WHAT IS CHILD FIND?

Federal, state and local regulations require all Ohio schools to conduct annual child find activities. Child Find is the process of locating and evaluating children with suspected disabilities who may be in need of special education and related services.

WHY IS THERE CHILD FIND?

The Rocky River City School District is obligated to locate and evaluate all children, ages three through twenty-one, within the district, with suspected disabilities. Although many school aged disabled children are identified and currently being served by the Rocky River City School District, pre-school children, ages three through five, with disabilities may be unidentified because parents may not be aware that programs and services are now available through the Rocky River City School District.



WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF CHILD FIND?

- To promote public awareness of disabilities.
- To alert parents, professionals and the public to children who may have special needs.
- To assist school districts in finding children who may have disabilities and who otherwise may not have come to their attention.
- To enable children and families to receive the special education and related services that are needed.

WHAT DOES A DISABILITY MEAN?

For ages three through five – A documented deficit in one or more of the following developmental areas: communication, vision, hearing, motor skills, social emotional/behavioral functioning, self-help skills, and/or cognitive skills.

For ages five through twenty-one – Identification of one or more of the following conditions: autism, blindness, hearing impairment including deafness, mental retardation, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, emotional disturbance, specific learning disability, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, and/or visual impairment including blindness.

WHO CAN HELP?

Parents, relatives, public and private agency employees, and concerned citizens are used to help school districts find any child, ages three through twenty-one, who may have a disability and need special education and related services. If you know of a child in the Rocky River City School District with a suspected disability who is not presently attending school or receiving services from another agency, please contact Jennifer Norman, Director of Pupil Services, at the Rocky River Board of Education 440.356.6006.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

Rocky River City School District personnel will contact the parent/guardian to find out if the child needs to be evaluated for a suspected disability. Free testing is available to families to determine whether or not a disability exists. If a disability need is identified, the child can begin receiving the appropriate special education and related services.
