## River Pride

RRHS received exciting news from the Ohio Department of Education that we have been nominated to apply for the 2012 National Blue Ribbon Award. This nomination is a great tribute to our students, teachers and our school district!

We are proud to recognize Brian Thorn, Kevin Arnold, and Ingrid Heider as they earned first place in the state in the Ohio Stock Market Challenge. This dynamic team competed against 660 other teams across the state. We congratulate business teacher, Mr. Davis on his students' accomplishment and note that this is the first time in RRHS history we have landed first place in this competition!

Congratulations to senior John Corcoran who has been selected to serve as one of two students in the state at the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary U. S. Senate Youth Program, which will be held in Washington D.C. in early March.

## High Honors/Honor Roll

Students' academic performance in the second quarter continues to be strong. Highlighting the "High Honor Rolls" were the freshmen and juniors with 91 and 71 respectively. A total of 294 students earned "High Honors" which recognizes cumulative Grade Point "Averages of 3.75 and higher, with no grades of D, F or I (incomplete). Thus, 34% of our student body is earning High Honors.

The "Honor Roll" is comprised of students whose cumulative Grade Point Average falls within the range of 3.0 to 3.74. Leading the way are seniors and juniors/sophomores are tied with 98 and 66 respectively. A total of 292 students made the Honor Roll. Overall 586 students or 68% of our student body earned recognition via one of the honor rolls. Congratulations to each and every student for their exceptional effort and academic focus!

## Ohio Graduation Tests (OGT)

Parents of sophomores should note that during the week of March 12-16, 2012, all 10<sup>th</sup> graders will be taking the OGT to meet a graduation requirement in all five test areas. Sophomores have been provided yearlong preparation through classes consisting of practice tests, reviewing test-taking strategies, and various opportunities for independent review via our Test Prep Lab in the Media Center. Please note that all sophomore students are required to attend a mandatory meeting on March 7, 2012 from 7:55-8:45 a.m. in the auditorium. Important information regarding OGT testing including room assignments, test times, test preparation tips, and an opportunity for students to ask questions will be discussed.

## Construction Update

We have been informed and report that the overall construction project is on time. The new science and music wings are under roof and contractors are working to create classrooms within the structure. Work continues on the main entrance on Detroit to get it under roof, as well as the new addition adjacent to the entrance. Looking ahead, we are making preparations for the invasion of contractors in the summer who will be working on the following areas expected to be completed by early August: New Commons Area, Media Center, Business Computer Lab, Technology Lab, Journalism Lab, and refurbishing of Counseling and Administrative offices. The summer relocation of the main offices and counseling offices will be printed in the April issue of the River Report.

### **Advanced Placement Testing**

Advanced Placement Testing will take place between May 7 and May 18, 2012 at Rocky River High School. All students enrolled in AP courses are strongly encouraged to take the exam. Depending on your score, and the college you plan on attending, you can save money and time through the college credit you earn! There is also a great deal to be gained from taking a college-level, high stakes exam. Many Rocky River students have taken advantage of this program and some have even started college as sophomores saving thousands of dollars in tuition costs. If you are a student whose future school does not accept AP credit, you should still take the exam. College students frequently change majors and universities during their first couple years and, if this happens to you, your AP scores may come in very handy.

### **AP Testing Costs**

The cost to the student is \$87.00 per exam and should be paid by check (made out to Rocky River High School). Mr. Knauss will be collecting AP exam orders beginning Monday, April 2nd through Wednesday, April 4th, 2012 with order forms being distributed the Friday beforehand. Students can leave their completed order forms in Mr. Knauss' mailbox in the main office or with their AP teacher. The initial and final order will be placed on April 4, 2012. No late registrations will be permitted after this date per the College Board. If your family is in need of financial assistance, please contact Mr. Knauss no later than Friday, March 30, 2012 at 3:30 p.m. so special arrangements can be made.

### **AP Testing for Students with Disabilities**

The AP program provides services and reasonable accommodations appropriate to student's disabilities and the purpose of the exam. Before exams for students with disabilities can be ordered, the student must be authorized to take an AP Exam with testing accommodations (such as extended testing time) and/or a nonstandard-format exam (such as Braille or photo enlarged). If you feel that your child is eligible for these services you must contact Mr. Knauss no later than February 14, 2012 at 3:30 p.m., so that the appropriate forms can be completed in time for the deadline. It is important to know that the grade report of a student who receives testing accommodations that include extended time will be marked "Nonstandard Administration."

### **Late Testing for the AP Exam**

Only students affected by extreme hardship may test late. Early testing is not permitted under any circumstances. To preserve the security of the AP Exams, the College Board develops alternate forms of each exam for students to use on a later testing date. If a student qualifies for late testing, they will incur a \$40.00 late testing fee per student per exam that will partially cover the cost to prepare, print, ship, and grade these exams. Students testing late may have their grades delayed up to a month. The deadline for students requesting their tests to be administered late must advise Mr. Knauss before March 30, 2012. If circumstances occur between March 30th and your test date which involve you being unable to take the test, please advise Mr. Knauss so that special arrangements can be made.

## **Advanced Placement Testing (continued)**

### **Mandatory Pre-Administration AP Session**

A mandatory pre-administration session will take place on May 2, 2012 at 8:00 a.m. in the RRHS Auditorium. Students must arrive on time and come prepared with a number 2 pencil (no mechanical pencils permitted) along with a solid surface to write on. All students registered for an AP exam MUST attend or they will not be permitted to take the test. During this session, all personal and survey information will be collected which generally takes approximately 40 minutes at the beginning of each exam. This will allow students to take their test as soon as possible which will give them a better chance for success.

#### **Film Fest**

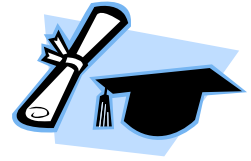

Specific instructions for entering on-line course requests, and the assigned USERNAME and PASSWORD will be mailed home on January 31 from the Principal's Office. The online scheduling program (DASL) is where students/parents are to enter course requests; it will be accessible from February 1 through February 9, 2012 at midnight. Please review and sign the **paper** Course Registration Form. The counselor-of-record will use this form to verify all course requests entered on-line. **PAPER** Course Registration Forms **MUST** be turned in during English class on Friday, February 10, 2012.

**Parents and students are strongly encouraged to communicate and work together during the course selection process.** Each family must give careful consideration to courses required for graduation. This focused process serves as an important step in preparation for post-secondary education and/or the world of work. Good planning and thoughtful course selection now will assist in scheduling priority choices.

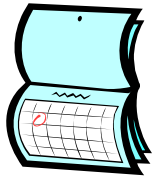

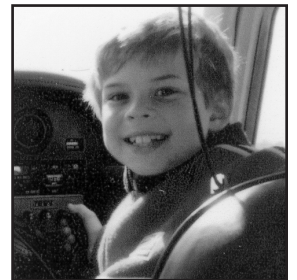
