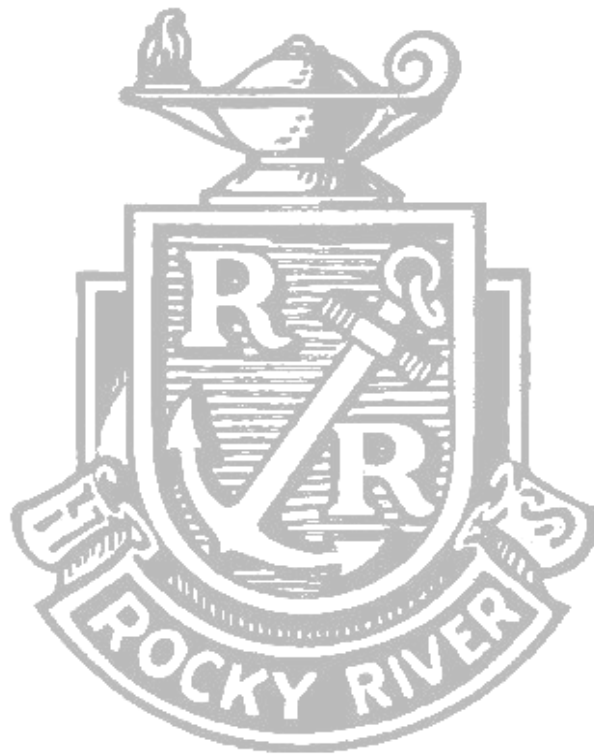

## **RIVER REPORT JULY 2011** **Forms and Links**



Keeping parents informed is a top priority at the Rocky River City School District. Therefore, we will continue to utilize the *AlertNow* Notification Service that allows us to send a telephone or email message to parents providing important information about emergencies or school events. In the event of an emergency at school, parents will be informed immediately by phone. The email notification service allows us to reduce paper and mailing costs and ensures that necessary information reaches our parents.

**Telephone messages** will be used for school cancellations or for emergencies.

**Email messages** will be used to notify parents about events such as report card distribution, open house, conferences, and to distribute items such as school newsletters.

To make the most effective use of this service, it is important to have an accurate email address for each family. Please update your e-mail address via the new Parent Portal using the on-line form submission or by contacting the Guidance Office at 440-356-6804.

### **Emergency Medical Authorization Forms**

**THIS FORM IS REQUIRED AND MUST BE ON FILE FOR EACH STUDENT**

Ohio law mandates that an Emergency Medical Authorization Form be completed and on file in the attendance office for every student attending RRHS. EMA's must be submitted on fee payment/schedule pick-up day. In accordance with state law, students who do not meet this requirement are not permitted to be in school until they comply.

The EMA enables parents/guardians to authorize the provision of emergency treatment for students who become ill or injured while under school authority. This authorization is required when all reasonable attempts to reach parents/guardians have failed and emergency medical treatment is required.



## **Free and Reduced Lunch Fee Waiver**

Students who qualify for reduced or free lunch are also eligible for reduced student fees or a total waiver of them. The form must be completed and returned as indicated. Students requesting a fee waiver must return the forms to the Principal's office. All submitted information will remain confidential. The *Free and Reduced*

## **Junior / Senior Option Forms**

Juniors and seniors eligible for the option privilege may receive permission to leave the building for lunch with parental/legal guardian permission. Lunch pass option and home option forms will be submitted on-line. Students **DO NOT** have permission to leave school unless and until the option form is approved and on file in the Assistant Principals' office.

## **Parking Permits**

Students driving to school must obtain a parking permit (\$25.00 each). Student parking lot rules and information are listed in the Parent/Student Handbook.

Parking permits may be purchased during schedule pick up days on August 10<sup>th</sup> or August 11<sup>th</sup> according to the outlined schedule. All permits must be purchased by Friday, September 2<sup>nd</sup> for students driving at this time.

Students are to park only in the areas designated for student parking. Visitor and faculty parking areas are off limits to students and parking privileges will be revoked for unauthorized parking. **Cars parked in an unauthorized area (including Christian Science Church lot) are subject to towing at the owner's expense.**

## Policies, Procedures and General Information

### Absences

Call **356-6020** anytime before 10:00 AM to report any/all student absences. An answering machine will record your message during evening and early morning hours when school is not open. You are asked to give *your name, student's name and grade, and the reason for the absence.*

If a call is not received, school personnel will contact the home regarding the absence. If telephone contact has not been made, it is necessary for the student to bring a note upon return to school, stating dates and reasons of absence. If a telephone call (or note) is not received within 24 hours after the absence, that absence will be considered unexcused.

**Please do not call the school and request that messages be delivered to students.**  
**We do not interrupt instruction to deliver personal messages.**

### Attendance/Discipline Procedure

To create and maintain a positive learning environment the RRHS staff strongly emphasizes the importance of consistent daily attendance, punctuality, and appropriate student behavior. Regular and punctual attendance helps to create an environment conducive to effective teaching and meaningful learning. We believe students should assume responsibility for their actions.

### Busing

Busing is not provided to RRHS students. Students must provide their own transportation. Busing is provided for students participating in athletics, band, field trips and other co-curricular activities.

### Cafeteria - Cove's Corner Pre-Payment Plan

Every Rocky River High School student has an account available to purchase school lunches (\$2.85). Finger imaging will access the account. Unlimited funds may be deposited into the account electronically or by cash payment. The cafeteria will be open to accept payments **August 10<sup>th</sup> and August 11<sup>th</sup> from 9:30 AM – 11:30 AM and 1:00PM – 3:00PM.**

Payments will be accepted during the school year **before first period each day** in the cafeteria. **Checks will not be accepted during lunch time.** A debit against the deposit will occur for each purchase made. Cash for purchases will be accepted. Credit will not be offered. The choice to pre-pay by electronic transfer of funds from a bank account or by credit card is available by establishing an account at [www.myschoolaccount.com](http://www.myschoolaccount.com)

Funds deposited by midnight will be in the debit account for student access the following school day. You will also have access to view your child's purchases and the account balance. Please contact Mrs. Eubanks with any questions in the Food Service Office at 356-6846.

## **Cell Phones/Electronic Devices**

The use of all electronic devices (e.g. cell phones, iPods, gaming devices, micro-tape recorders, cameras, etc.) is prohibited. Students violating this provision will have the item confiscated and a disciplinary action will be assigned. Repeated offenses will result in the item being returned only to a parent.

However, cell phones may be used before and after school hours and during the student's lunch period in the **cafeteria only**.

## **Detentions**

Morning school detentions are held from 7:15 - 7:45 AM in room 106. Extended Day detentions are held from 3:15 – 4:15 PM in room 133.

## **Discipline Sanctions**

Morning and Extended Day detentions, In-School Restriction (ISR) and Out-of-School Suspensions (OSS) may be utilized as disciplinary consequences.

## **Dress Code**

Please review the list provided below. Additional information regarding the dress code can be found on page 22 of the parent/student handbook.

- Students must wear shoes or sandals at all times.
- Hats and/or any type of head coverings may **not** be worn in school.
- Midriffs are **not** to be exposed. Shirts must be able to be tucked in.
- Sleeveless shirts (boys) and spaghetti straps (girls) are **unacceptable**. Young ladies are **not** to wear low-cut tops. Students are to have their shoulders covered at all times.
- Students are expected to wear appropriate undergarments, which are to be covered and not visible.
- All pants and shorts are to be worn at one's true waist - shorts must be at mid-thigh or longer.
- Pajama-type pants and spandex are **not** permitted.
- Shorts and skirts must be at mid-thigh length or longer.
- Any clothing or jewelry depicting inappropriate language, signs, symbols or advocacy of drugs, alcohol, tobacco, hate symbols or sexual references is unacceptable. *Also, any article deemed by the administration to be in poor taste for school is unacceptable.*
- Sunglasses may not be worn.
- No chains or spiked jewelry of any type are permitted.

## **Fees**

Parents will receive an invoice for all fees, based on the student's finalized schedule. The invoice will be mailed home the first week of August. Items (workbooks, Student Plan Book, etc.) for which fees are normally collected will be distributed by the teachers the first week of school. *Fees for transportation, student parking permits, band and other miscellaneous items will not be included on the fee invoice.* Fees must be paid on either August 10<sup>th</sup> or August 11<sup>th</sup> according to following schedule:

## **Immunization Requirements**

In recent years public health officials have expressed great concern that increasingly large numbers of children are not being properly immunized. This could lead to epidemics and serious public health problems. Guidelines have been adopted for the Rocky River City School District and are available in the high school office.

## **Lockers**

Locker assignments and combinations will remain the same as last year for all sophomores, juniors and seniors. New locker assignments will be given *only* to freshmen and new students during fee payment/schedule pick-up days on August 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>. If your student needs a copy of his or her combination, it will be available in the auditorium on *August 25<sup>th</sup> before 1<sup>st</sup> period.*

## **Tardy Policy**

A student who is tardy to school must report **directly** to the attendance office. If he/she is tardy to class, he should report directly to that class. If he/she is detained by a teacher, the student should obtain a pass from that teacher, not the office. The office will assign detentions for tardiness to school and only penalize chronic offenders. The classroom teacher will assign detention for repeated tardiness to class. If tardiness to class is excessive, a student will be referred to the associate or assistant principal.

1. 3 tardies all year - no consequences.
2. 4th tardy - 1 detention.
3. 5th tardy - 2 detentions.
4. 6th tardy - 1 Extended Day detention; letter to parents.
5. 7th tardy - 3 Extended Day detentions & options revoked.
6. 8th tardy - 1 day ISR; meeting with principal & options revoked.
7. 9th tardy - 1 day OSS; meeting with parents & continued loss of option.
8. 10th tardy - 3 days OSS; meeting with parents & loss of lunch option privileges for the first semester of the following school year.
9. 11th tardy - Referral to principal for further consequences and remedial action plan. Another parent conference will be required.

**NOTE:** *Students who are tardy 20 minutes or more will have this count as an unexcused absence (class cut).*

*Tardiness will only be excused for specific reasons (the same legal reasons as apply to absence). Please refer to the Parent/Student Handbook.*
