- A lake inside a rainforest on the Caribbean island of Dominica sizzles at around 158.4°F!
- A fifth of our freshwater is found in tropical rainforests, the Amazon Basin to be exact!
- Rainforests only cover around 2 percent the total surface area of the Earth, but really about 50 percent of the plants and animals on the earth live in the rainforest!

IF YOU'RE RIGHT HANDED

1. Hold the bow out sideways with your **left** hand
2. Take an arrow out of your pouch

4. Turn your bow so it's vertical
