

CAREER SYNOPSIS: In the brief five-year history of the Baldwin Wallace University women's lacrosse program, Maddie Russell is arguably the best to ever play women's lacrosse at the University. Maddie helped the Yellow Jackets to compile a 46-21 record, an OAC regular season title in 2015 and advance to the OAC Championship Game twice. Individually, she played and started in 66 consecutive career games and scored a school-record 152 goals, added 81 assists (second all-time) for a school-record 233 career points. She took 282 career shots, including 219 on-goal (a school-record .694 on-goal shooting percentage) with school-records of 284 ground balls, 197 draw controls and 174 caused turnovers.

2017 CoSIDA DIVISION III ACACDEMIC ALL-AMERICAN AT-LARGE: As a senior in 2016-2017, Maddie was a CoSIDA Division III second-team Academic All-American in the At-Large catagory.

CoSIDA ACADEMIC HONORS: As a junior in 2015-2016 and senior in 2016-2017, Maddie received first-team CoSIDA Division III Academic All-District 7 At-Large honors and qualified for the CoSIDA national Academic All-America ballot.

CLYDE LAMB AWARD: As a senior in 2016-2017, Maddie was named as the BW Female Clyde Lamb Award winner to the Ohio Athletic Conference. The award recognizes the top male and female student-athlete from each of the OAC"s 10 academic institutions.

BW ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE AWARD: As a sophomore, junior and senior, Maddie received a BW Academic Excellence Award for having the Highest Grade Point Average on the women's lacrosse team.

ACADEMIC ALL-OAC: Maddie was a three-time Academic All-Ohio Athletic Conference selection (2015, 2016 and 2017).

A TWO-TIME OAC PLAYER OF THE YEAR: As a sophomore in 2014-2015, was the OAC Defensive Player of the Year. As a senior in 2016-2017, Maddie was the OAC Midfielder of the Year.

A FOUR-TIME ALL-OAC SELECTION: Maddie was a four-time first-team All-OAC selection.

A THREE-TIME ALL-WEST REGION PICK: As a senior in 2016-2017, Maddie was a first-team All-West Region selection by the IWLCA (Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association). As a sophomore in 2014-2015 and junior in 2015-2016, Maddie earnd second-team All-West honors. As a sophomore and junior, Maddie also earned IWLCA All-Academic honors.

A THREE-TIME BW MOST VALUABLE PLAYER: Maddie was the BW Most Valuable player as a sophomore, junior and senior.

BW CAREER RECORDS: Maddie ended her career as a six-time school career record-holder. She owns records for the most goals scored (152), total points scored (233), ground balls (285), draw controle (199), caused turnovers (174) and free position goals (41).

ALL-TIME NCAA RANKINGS: Maddie is the NCAA Division III all-time career-leader in caused turnovers with 174, and ranks second all-time in ground balls with 285.

THROUGH-THE-YEARS: As a freshman in 2013-2014, Maddie played her first season of lacrosse and earned her first varsity letter. She started all 18 games, scored 55 goals and had 24 assists for 79 points and was second on the team in all three categories. She also set BW single-season school-records for caused turnovers (58) and Free-position goals (20). She also had 40 draw controls and 96 ground balls. Maddie was named as the OAC Women's Lacrosse Player of the Week on March 31 for her efforts in wins versus Franciscan University, Hilbert (N.Y.) College and Olivet (Mich.) College. BW set a single-season school-record with 14 victories, finished 14-4 overall and advanced to the OAC Championship Match. As a sophomore in 2014-2015, Maddie played her second season of lacrosse and earned her second letter. She was a first-team All-OAC selection and the OAC Defensive Player of the Year. Maddie also was a second-team IWLCA (Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association) second-team All-Great Lakes Region pick and the BW Most Valuable Player. She played in all 14 games, including 10 starts, and scored a team-leading 29 goals with 17 assists (second) for a team-high 46 points. She also led the team with 52 ground balls, 50 draw controls, 48 caused turnovers and six free position goals. BW finished 8-6 overall and advanced to the OAC Championship Game for the second straight year.


As a junior in 2015-2016, Maddie played her third season of lacrosse and earned her third varsity letter. She was a first-team All-OAC selection, was a second-team IWLCA All-Region pick, and earned first-team CoSIDA Division III Academic All-District 7 At-Large honors. Maddie played in all 18 games, scored 30 goals and added 26 assists for 56 points. Maddie also caused a team-high 33 turnovers and had a team-high 64 ground balls. In a non-conference game versus Southwestern (Texas) University she set a school-record with eight assists and scored one goal for a career-high nine points. BW had an 11-7 overall record and advanced to the OAC semifinals.

As a senior in 2016-2017, Maddie is playing her fourth season of lacrosse and hopes to earn her fourth varsity letter. She started at midfield for the fourth straight year. Maddie capped her tremendous career by being named as a IWLCA Division III honorable mention All-American and as a CoSIDA Division III straight time and was the OAC Midfielder of the Year and a first-team All-West Region selection. She also was an Academic All-OAC pick for the third straight year and earned CoSIDA Division III first-team Academic All-District 7 honors for the second straight time. Maddie earned her second OAC Offensive Player of the Week honor on March 27 and her third career OAC Player of the Week award and second Offensive Player of the Week honor this season on April 10, 2017. Maddie earned her fourth career OAC Player of the Week award and third Offensive Player of the Week honor this season on April 17. She played and started all 17 games, led the team with 38 goals, tied for fourth with 14 assists and had a team-high 52 points. Maddie also led the team with 73 ground balls, 56 draw controls and 35 caused turnovers. BW finished 13-4 overall, tied for the OAC regular season title and advanced to the OAC Championship Game.

2016 (Senior) (Outdoor): Thiel College graduate Morgan Berg was officially named a nominee Tuesday for the 2016 NCAA Woman of the Year award.

The Woman of the Year Award program, established in 1991, is in its 26th year of existence. There were 517 honorees in 2016, 169 of which represented Division III. Of the 517 honorees, Berg was among the 127 student-athletes who competed in more than one sport.

Berg was named to the 2016 USTFCCCA All-Academic NCAA Division III Women's Track & Field Team. Berg was one of 423 women from 129 institutions to earn USTFCCCA All-Academic honors for individuals with combined academic and athletic accomplishments.

To qualify for the USTFCCCA All-Academic Track & Field Team, a student-athlete must maintain a cumulative grade-point average of 3.30. In addition, they must have competed in an NCAA indoor or outdoor championship or finished the regular season ranked in the national top 35 in an individual event or ranked in the national top 25 in a relay event.

In May, Berg was named to the USTFCCCA All-Mideast Region team in the 100-meter hurdles with the second-best time in the region (14.41). She was also named to the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) Academic All-District First Team. Berg was one of Thiel College's representatives at the Third Annual PAC Scholar Athlete of the Year Banquet in May. An early childhood/special education major, Berg has secured an elementary teaching job in Virginia, and she may be interested in coaching track & field in the future.

Berg earned her fourth-straight indoor track & field title in the 60-meter hurdles, finishing with a winning and conference record time of 9.03 seconds in the finals, at the PAC Indoor Championships in February. She finished first and set school and conference records in the 100-meter hurdles (14.55) at the PAC Outdoor Championships in April. She also won the triple jump (35-0.5) and finished fifth in the long jump (15-11.5) at this year's outdoor championships. Since the PAC Outdoor Championships, she broke her own school record in the 100-meter hurdles on multiple occasions. Her best career finish in the 100-meter hurdles (14.41) occurred during the 11th Annual Gator Invitational, hosted by Allegheny College, on May 13. Berg went on to place 12th in the 100-meter hurdles (14.48) at the 2016 NCAA Division III Outdoor Track & Field Championships.

2015 (Junior) (Outdoor): Ran for fourth in the 100m hurdles and 46th in the 200m dash at Early Bird Invitational...Took first place in the 100m hurdles at the Bobcat Invitational and finished eighth in the 200m dash...Earned third in the 100m hurdles and second the triple jump at the Slippery Rock Open...Finished ninth at the Westminster Invitational and took the first place medal in the 100m hurdles...Earned third place with both the 4x100m and 4x400m relay team and earned seventh in long jump at the PAC North Quad...Earned 17th in the triple jump and sixth in the 100m hurdles at the Dave Labor Invitational...Won the triple jump event (34-05), ran for sixth place with the 4x400m relay team and earned second in the 100m hurdles with a time of 14.92 seconds, which is a lifetime best and a new school record at the PAC Outdoor Championships.
