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

Final Exam Schedule & Exemptions:

Final exams for seniors will take place on June 1st, 2nd and 5th. Underclassmen finals will take place on June 6th, 7th and 8th. Senior exams will operate on our regular bell schedule. Underclassmen finals will operate on an adjusted bell schedule, which is available on the high school website. All students are required to take final exams during their scheduled times. The only exemptions are as follows: students who have maintained straight A/A- for the entire year (juniors and seniors only); students in an AP class who took the AP exam and maintained a B- or higher for the entire year; and students taking any College Credit Plus classes.

Just a Little Nicer: Compassion in the Digital Age

Research shows that people are much less compassionate when they don't communicate face-to-face, rather when they communicate digitally. There is a generation of children growing up now where digital communication is the primary mode of communication they've known. The skill sets of communicating face-to-face, compassion, and empathy may not be learned. The consequences of this are potentially huge.

Krista Tippett, host of *On Being* and recipient of the National Humanities Medal states, "Our culture is obsessed with perfection and with hiding problems. Our problems are probably our richest sources for rising to this higher virtue of compassion...we have to embody this virtue in front of our children". Author Robert Write also states that when it comes to showing compassion, we are designed to display compassion selectively and then justify that display; we only select those we deem deserving. There are more ways than ever to be cruel which is why it has become imperative that we, each of us, rethink the meaning of compassion and model it for our children and students.

The attached link contains an episode of the TED Radio Hour titled *Just a Little Nicer*. In this podcast, the host discusses compassion from a variety of perspectives and with individuals such as Sally Kohn, Krista Tippett, Robert Wright, Karen Armstrong, and Daniel Goleman. It is thought provoking as it encourages us to think about our behavior and how we can better model behavior, especially in the digital age, for our children.
