District soccer is wide open

Soccer fans must be salivating when looking at the brackets for the Division I girls soccer Rocky River district. The district is arguably the most competitive in the state. All four seeds are capable of winning it and traditional powers Magnificat, Bay and North Olmsted are also in the district.

Avon Lake (11-3-1) won their first-ever Southwestern Conference title and earned the top seed. Earlier this season, the Shoregals defeated second-seeded Westlake 2-1. The Demons have played well lately winning six in a row and seven of eight since that loss. Westlake (9-4) choose to move up to the Shoregals' side of the bracket and the two teams could meet in the semifinals on Oct. 27. One team that could play spoiler is Magnificat. The Blue Streaks (6-5-3) open at Rocky River High School against Lorain Oct. 20 at 5 p.m. The winner plays at Avon Lake at 3 p.m. on Oct. 23. Magnificat lost to Avon Lake 1-0 last week and was the last team to beat Westlake.

Avon (10-2-1) and Rocky River (9-2-2) are the third and fourth seeds. The two teams tied in the regular season 0-0. Both defeated top seed Avon Lake in the regular season. Magnificat also has beaten Rocky River while Avon defeated Magnificat. The bottom of the bracket opens with four games at 7 p.m. on Oct. 20. Avon hosts Elyria and Rocky River is home for Vermilion. Berea travels to Bay and Amherst will visit North Olmsted.

Lake Ridge Academy is the top seed in the D-II Rocky River district. The Lions (9-1-1) will host the winner of Brooklyn and Open Door on Oct. 21 at 4:30 p.m.. Firelands (5-5) earned the fourth seed. The Falcons will host Keystone on Oct. 18 at 7 p.m. The winner of that game will host the winner of the Lutheran West/Oberlin game on Oct. 21. The Longhorns host the Phoenix at 5 p.m. on Oct. 18.

Cuyahoga Heights (12-1-1) and Fairview (7-4-2) are seeded second and third. The two teams played to a scoreless tie earlier this season. Fairview will play Columbia at Rocky River High School on Oct. 18 at 7 p.m. The winner of that game will host the winner of Trinity and Brookside, who play on Oct. 18 at 4:30 p.m. Elyria Catholic will host Black River at 7 p.m. on Oct. 18. The winner of that game will travel to the winner of Cuyahoga Heights and Independence.

Avon girls soccer falls in double overtime to Rocky River

AVON -- Avon's fantastic season came to a heart-breaking end.

In the Division I Rocky River District Semifinal, Rocky River senior Allison McFarland scored in 104th minute to give Rocky River a 2-1 win at Avon Stadium Wednesday.

Avon finishes its impressive season at 15-3-1, while Rocky River improves to 15-1-2. Earlier in the season, the two teams played to a 0-0 tie and were co-champions of the West Shore Conference.

"(I) have to give Rocky River credit," Avon Coach Tony DiMacchia said. "They got the result. It was a hard-fought game. We got down early and gave ourselves an opportunity and tied it up. I'm proud of my girl's efforts. They battled

and worked hard. We just didn't find the back of the net."

Avon trailed 1-0 at the half, but was able to tie the game with just over 17minutes left in regulation when Devon Saini converted on a penalty kick. The two teams made runs as regulation came to a close, but neither team was able to break the deadlock to force the overtime.

Avon had the best opportunity to end the game in the first overtime, but Rocky River goalie Kim Leitch made a nice save off a shot by Megan Garner.

Early in the second overtime, Rocky River had a chance to end the game when a foul was called on Avon just outside the penalty box which resulted in a free kick. Sarah Molina took the free kick and rifled a shot to the right-hand side of the net. Avon goalie Holly Kraus made a punch save to shoot the ballo ver the crossbar and preserve Avon's season momentarily.

Molina, who is a Division I recruit, proved to play a pivotal role in the final outcome. Taking another free kick on the left side of the penalty box, Molina's shot hit Avon's wall of defenders. The ball bounced out to McFarland, who had moved up from her outside back position. A good bounce allowed the ball to rest at her feet and the senior drove her shot past a diving Kraus to give Rocky River the win. McFarland's first goal of the season couldn't have come at a better time.

"The ball was there and I knew I had to get it," she said. "I'm thrilled. It made my season." McFarland was able to work her way up with Avon packing it in to defend the free kick.

"We were so busy packing it in because the ball was right outside the box, "DiMacchia said. "She floated in there. The ball landed at her feet and she made a nice strike and it went into the back of the net.

"Holly had a great game. She made some brilliant saves and kept us in the game. She has nothing to keep her head down about that. That was a good strike. She just missed it. She was right there."

Rocky River took an early 1-0 lead with Stephanie Davis scoring after Avon was unable to clear the ball and turned it over.

Kraus, who had five saves, was outstanding between the posts. She stopped two shots early in the second half and had some help as a Rocky River shot hit the post.

Looking to add a little more speed and hoping for a spark, DiMacchia made some changes in his lineup. The shake-up proved to be effective with Avon being

able to push the ball up the field and create some scoring chances. Though Rocky River was able to hold them off, it was only a matter of time before Avon got the chance they needed.

Freshman Kelsey Lawler, who was inserted in the lineup, made a pushdown the right-hand side. She drove into the penalty box and was eventually taken down to give Avon a penalty kick. Saini drilled home the penalty kick, tying the game at one.

Avon had chances to break the deadlock in regulation, but Leitch made a nice save on an Holly Ohradzansky and a pair of corner kicks were eventually cleared. "We were creating some opportunities," DiMachhia said. "The adjustments worked. I am proud of my girls. They worked their butts off. They gave themselves every opportunity to win that game. We believe we could win. It was a hard-fought game and a difficult loss."

Westlake earns district title over old rival

WESTLAKE - One goal plus one spectacular save equals school history.

For years, the Westlake and Rocky River girls' soccer teams butted heads in the Southwestern Conference and the two renewed their rivalry in the Division I district final game yesterday afternoon.

The Demons captured their third-straight district championship with a thrilling 1-0 win against the Pirates. Second-seeded Westlake (15-5) advances to the regionals to face the winner of yesterday's Strongsville-Holy Name contest. River bows out with a 15-3-2 mark.

The three straight regional appearances are a first for Westlake in any sports.

"There's no question that this was a 100 percent team effort," Demons head coach Scott Jones said. "It took every single person; it wasn't just one that won the game for us today."

Rocky River forced the issue early with a couple of near misses. Sarah Molina crossed a ball to Sarah Artiste who headed the ball just left of the goal on the first close call.

Jessica Goepfert and Molina combined on a couple of picture-perfect passes to get the ball to Grace Bennett right in front of the goal. Bennett turned and ripped a ball that was smothered by Demons goalie Stephanie Poeppleman in the 24th minute.

Prendergast came up with her highlight film goal for the 1-0 Westlake lead, four minutes after the rocket from Bennett.

Prendergast weaved her way through three defenders and the faked out goalie Kim Leitch for the only goal of the match.

"I was dribbling down the left side and usually I look for someone," Prendergast said. "I took the girl(s) one-on-one and found the near post. Coach Jones told us to keep taking our defenders one-on-one to the goal."

After the Prendergast goal, the Pirates tried turning up the pressure, but the defensive backfield of Sarah Stachowiak, Maddie Sandhu and Charlotte Tate turned away the Rocky River advances.

"(Sarah) Stachowiak and Poeppleman do a really good job back there," Jones said. "Those two have played together since they were 8 or 9-years-old as a goalie and a sweeper. They do a great job as did (Maddie) Sandhu and (Charlotte) Tate. They don't get the same publicity, but they work just as hard and did a great job."

The Demons had a couple of chances to build on their lead when Prendergast had a shot turned away in the 60th minute and Julie Moroney had a header go just high off a Sarah Stroh corner-kick a minute later.

The game looked like it was going to drastically change with 17:41 remaining in the contest when Moroney was whistled for a foul on Rocky River's Megan McFarland and she was awarded a penalty kick.

Moroney ripped a shot that went to the right of Demons goalie Stephanie Poeppleman. She laid straight out to her right and deflected the ball safely away to preserve the lead and the game for Westlake.

"Sarah (Molina) and I are really good friends and we play on the same club team together," Poeppleman said. "I had a little bit of inkling that I knew which way she was going — if you know what I mean."

In the closing seconds of the game, the Pirates made a mad rush to get the equalizer and Hannah McCue broke open at the top of the box, before she could set up for a shot, Rachel Evans poked the ball away and the clock rode down to zeros before Rocky River could make another run.
