A Review of the 2021 Season

When a 2021 Rocky River Girls Soccer (RRGS) player or fan reflects on this year, what big non-soccer events will they remember? Covid-19 was still happening, but we did get the vaccines. The year started historically with the January 6th insurrection on the Capital. The United States officially pulled out of Afghanistan ending the 20-year, longest war in US history. A winter storm in Texas knocked out power for almost 10 million people. An unusual and unmemorable summer Olympics took place in Japan. The RRHS Girls Basketball won the Conference title which was last won in 2012. The RRHS Girls Lacrosse team made it to the State Championship, losing to Cincinnati Mariemont (6-16). The RRHS football team made it to the third round of the playoffs, the farthest any RRHS football team has ever gone.



However, I believe when we reflect upon the 2021 RRGS season, it will be thought of as “So good, but so close.” The 2021 team had many achievements and they were so close to breaking many records but fell just short of great success.

The 2021 season started off with a THUD in its first game with RRGS giving up 6 goals at Bishop Watterson in a 3-6 loss. The last time an RRGS team gave up 6 or more goals was the 2016 RRGS Team (9-10-0) when they lost to Holy Name 2-6. But what a turn-around! The 2021 Team went on a 7-game winning streak, including 5 shutouts, and only allowing 2 goals while scoring 39 goals.

Then Bay happened. A loss of 0-2 to Bay pretty much ended conference championship chances. It was a game that Bay had only taken 5 shots to River’s 14 shots. RRGS would go on to finish 2nd in the GLC-West and 3rd overall in the Great Lakes Conference (GLC).

Just like after the Bishop Watterson game, following the Bay game, tweaks were made to the line-up and formation and RRGS went on a 12-game winning streak, including 8 straight shutouts. RRGS ended the regular season (14-2-0) only allowing 10 goals (6 by Watterson, 2 by Bay, 1 each by Buckeye and Lakewood) while scoring 71 goals! The 2013 RRGS Team scored 94 goals in their regular season and the 71 goals of 2021 RRGS is the next most tied with the 1995 RRGS Team which included a 14-0 victory over Villa Angela St Joseph that year. The record for fewest goals allowed in a regular season is 6 held by the 2010, 2013, and 2020 RRGS teams. 10 goals allowed by 2021 RRGS is 4th best.

The 2021 Team cruised through the playoffs crushing everyone until the State Semi-Final Game. Until that game, the closest playoff game was the 5-1 victory in the Regional Championship over Lima Shawnee. Then there was the State Semi-Final Game against Chagrin Falls, a team that RRGS had ruled 43 days earlier and beat 2-0 with RRGS having 18 shots to their 4 shots and 13 corner kicks to their 2.

In the State Semi-Final Game, Chagrin Falls scored 75 seconds and 18 minutes into the game from set pieces: a corner kick and a throw-in. Of the 3 losses during the season, set piece goals contributed hugely in 2 of the losses: Watterson (2) and Chagrin Falls (3). Whereas, set pieces for the 2021 RRGS team was problematic, especially corner kicks. For the season, RRGS scored on 9 of their 150 corner kick attempts (6%) and the opponents were 3 for 30 (10%) on their corner kicks.

Although down 0-2 eighteen minutes in, RRGs did not collapse and put pressure on Chagrin Falls equalizing the score 10 minutes into the 2nd half. But even with all the possession and shot advantages over Chagrin Falls, RRGs could not find the back of the net again and eventually fell 2-3.

So how close did the 2021 RRGs team come from completing their objectives:

- Finished as a Semi-Finalist in the State Tournament to the eventual State Champion while outplaying them most of the game for the second year in a row.
- Finished 3rd in GLC stopping their 4-year GLC Champions streak to Bay while outplaying them.
- Finished tied for 2nd with the 2020 Team for RRGs all-time wins with 19 and behind the 2013 Team (22).
- Finished 2nd for most goals in a season with 111 goals behind the 2013 Team (129).
- Finished 2nd for most goals/game average in a season with 5.05 behind the 2013 Team (5.57).
- Finished tied for 2nd with the 2013 Team for RRGs all-time most shutouts in a season with 14 shutouts behind the 2020 Team (15).
- Finished 2nd for longest shutout streak in a season with 8 behind the 2010 Team (9).

The scoring for the 2021 team was relatively evenly distributed. Nine players had double digits in Points which is one more player than the powerhouse 2013 Team which only had 8 double-digit point scorers. Ava Patti pretty much missing the first 8 games of the season hindered her assault on the scorebook, but she still finished 2nd on the team in Goals (15) and 3rd in points (41).

The 2021 RRGs Team had to replace last year's record setting defense (GK-Sabrina Rick, LDef-Cecilia Wischmeier, CDef-Kiera Vesy, and RDef-Mia Kelly) and one of the best centers (Maya Patti) to play for RRGs. The 2021 defensive team of Chloe Eberlein (RDef), Addie Harris (CDef), Sienna Roselli (CDef), Riley Wasserman (LDef), and Caitlin Rose (GK) proved almost the equal of that team. The role of center mid eventually was rotated between Ava Patti, Cara McKenna, McKenzie Russell, and Addie Harris. The wingers, Taylor Byall and Sophia Murray, stayed the same from the 2021 team with some off the bench time from Vivian Brandt and Sophia Sindelar. The forwards had a rotation of Maeve Kelly, Annika Mocho, Ava Patti and Freshman Swiss Army Knife, Sophia Sindelar.

Individually, for the 2021 season:

- Caitlin Rose, as the goalkeeper, gets credit for the impressive Shutout Totals (14) and Shutout Streak (8) and ranked her in 2nd place all-time for a season.
- Maeve Kelly's 20 goals and 10 assists performance placed her 13th all-time for Points and 11th all-time for Goals in a season.

For the seven 2021 Seniors finishing their career with RRGs, they went 61-17-5 overall, 25-2-2 in Conference play and 15-4 in playoffs. Which is the best career next to the 2013 Seniors (72-8-4, 25-1-1, 17-3). They achieved 3 Conference Championships, 3 District Championships, and 2 Regional Championships and every season was ended by either the State Runner-Up (2018 Bay, 2019 Mansfield Madison) or the State Champion (2020 Mansfield Madison, 2021 Chagrin Falls).

Sophia Murray finishes her career in 10th place all-time for points (98) and goals (38) with 22 assists. Addie Harris finished in 11th place all-time in career assists (26). It should be noted that sophomore, Ava Patti, has moved into a tie for 8th place for points (99) with Emily Soltes and a tie for 6th place for goals (43) with her sister, Maya, and Ava has 13 career assists.

Caitlin Rose's freshman goalkeeping of 14 shutouts puts her 9th all-time for career shutouts which is almost halfway to Kim Leitch's career record of 31 shutouts in 4 seasons as the starting goalkeeper.

Taylor Byall earned 2nd Team All Ohio making it the 20th time an RRGs player has received such an award and United Soccer Coaches All Central Region Team (Fall – OH, IN, MN).

The 2013 Seniors had the most varsity games in their 4-year career (84) but none of them played every game as a freshman. In fact, only Grace Bennett, Megan Killeen and McKenna Klodnick, played any varsity as a freshman and their play was nothing significant until half-way through the season.

The 2021 Seniors had the second most varsity games played in their 4-year career (83) where Sophia Murray and Addie Harris played as freshman from the start. 2014 Senior, Eva Schneider, never missed and started all 82 games in her 4-year career which is the record for most games played. Murray played in every game in her career except the game against Normandy at Byers field when she injured her toe in the previous game against Chagrin Falls her junior year. Murray finishes tied with Schneider at 82 career RRGs games played. THE BEST ABILITY IS AVAILABILITY.

Another significant achievement in 2021 was Coach Patrick Hopkins getting his 200th career win which happened at and against Elyria Catholic. This is Hopkins' 16th season as RRGs head coach, and he is currently 213-76-24. He got his 100th win on the last day of the 2013 regular season. It took him 8 seasons to get his first 100 wins and it took another 8 seasons to get his next 100 wins. He is currently averaging 13.3 wins/season. As coach, he won his 6th District title and his 3rd Regional title this year.

As an aside, the RRGs person with the second most District and Regional titles is 2021 GCSSCA Assistant Coach of the Year, McKenna Klodnick, with 5 District titles (3 as a player and 2 as a coach) and 2 Regional titles (1 as a player and 1 as a coach).

Speaking of JV: The 2021 RRGs JV team finished 13-1-0 with 73 goals and allowing 9 goals, which I believe is the best JV season in RRGs history.

The number of multi-sports girls' soccer players on this year's RRGs team is astounding.

A little factoid: the RRHS coach with the current longest streak as a head coach is girls' track and field head coach, Julie Achlides, since 1992 (28 seasons). Mike Murray became the girls' head basketball coach beginning in 1998 before moving over to become the boys' head basketball coach in 2010 (total of 24 seasons). In 2005, Kevin Zerbey was named the boys' head soccer coach (Hopkins was a boys assistant coach) and in 2006, Hopkins was named the girls' head soccer coach (16 seasons). Mark Hogya has been around a long time as the boy's head track and field coach and so has coach Chris Cogan as the hockey coach (both 10+ seasons).

Season Review by Kent Klodnick

Rocky River High School (RRHS) is a public high school consisting of grades 9-12 with an enrollment of about 900 students whereas no student lives more than 2.5 miles from the school and RRHS is surrounded by private schools: Rocky River Magnificat High School (500 yards), Rocky River Lutheran West High School (1.4 miles), Cleveland St Joseph Academy (2.9 miles), Lakewood St Edwards High School (3.9 miles) and Cleveland St Ignatius High School (8.1 miles) that filters away some of the city (21,755 per 2020 census) of Rocky River's student athlete population.

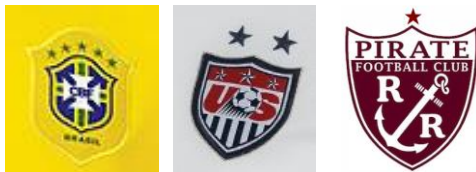
Rocky River High School Girls Soccer Team Crest History

When Coach Hopkins became the head coach of RRGs back in the Fall of 2006, he started a new tradition by incorporating a logo/crest which would be unique for the RRGs team.

He borrowed ideas from an English Premier League team's crest, the Liverpool Football Club and the Rocky River School System's logo at the time and merged them. This explains why it reads "FOOTBALL" and not "SOCCER"




When the crest was established, RRGs had never won a Conference Championship or a District Final.



In its 21st year of existence, RRGs won its first Conference title as the 2008 West Shore Conference Champions. To recognize this achievement, a ★ was added to the crest much like how countries add stars to their national uniforms for each of their World Cup wins.

This was followed by more WSC Championships in 2010, 2011 and 2013.

The ultimate goal of a lifetime is a State Championship which was last accomplished by a Rocky River High School team in 1927 by the Boys Track Team.

However, if that was ever achieved, then a  would be added to the crest which would symbolize the achievement which gives the logo ending the 2013 season as...



In 2014 a WSC Championship star and in 2018 a GLC Championship had to be added to the logo version and again for 2019 and 2020....

The Goal of the Year is presented to the player the scored an important or memorable goal during the season.

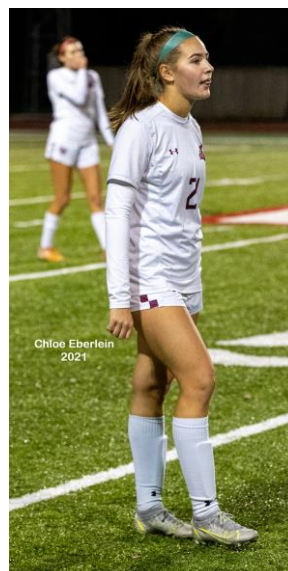
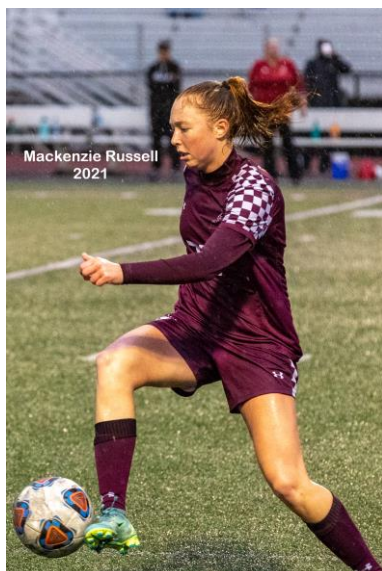
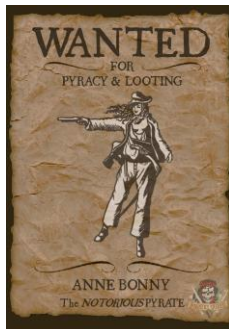

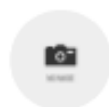
And the Pirates on yet another night stand as keepers of a win streak.

"There's so many teams that never, never make it to the districts, never make it to the regionals," the Oak Harbor coach said she told her players. "Be proud of what we did and how far we got. Is it disappointing? Absolutely. There's no words. You see this great group of kids that have worked together so hard for so long and wanted it so badly."

Rocky River (18-2) was too much for the Rockets on Tuesday night at Huron High School in a Division II girls soccer regional semifinal as the Pirates won 6-0. Most of the play took place in Oak Harbor's defensive end as the Rockets struggled to find a way out of pressure. Ripley St. Clair made 12 saves for Oak Harbor in her final high school game.

The Rockets concluded the season with a 14-4-3 record after winning their second district championship in three seasons and their third consecutive SBC Bay Division crown.

The loss ends the high school careers of 12 seniors: Hannah Schulte, Remi Gregory, Emma Baumgartner, Katy May, Kori Helle, Amelia Mizelle, St. Clair, Kaley Daniel, Maggie Puckett, Ally Garner and Cienna Heineman.

"It seems like every so often we come in with a big group of girls like this, and it's just so fun to watch them play and grow through the years, and they've done so well," Williamson said. "Every year you can see them get a little bit better and a little bit better."

The pattern developed quickly Tuesday night. Rocky River passed swiftly and Oak Harbor chased. The Pirates peppered St. Clair in goal. She made three early saves, including a double save as she denied a shooter after a rebound, to keep things scoreless for the first 10 minutes.

But with 28:30 left until halftime, Sophia Sindelar cut in from the right wing and found the back of the net, and the Pirates kept it up from there. Sindelar scored again later in the half after Ava Patti had made it 2-0. And with less than 10 minutes until halftime, Cara McKenna tucked a long-distance shot under the crossbar for a 4-0 intermission margin.

"Fast. Quick. Everything off their foot is right," Williamson said of Rocky River. "If it's not to their feet, it's to someone else's feet. They're good. We kind of anticipated that, but not to that extent."

Because Oak Harbor had to put most of its players behind the ball, even when the Rockets won possession, there wasn't much of an outlet. It was the nature of the matchup. Oak Harbor couldn't sell out offensively against a higher-powered team, but that made it that much more difficult to find one goal, let alone the amount needed to keep pace with Rocky River.

"I thought that our defense played their hearts out," Williamson said. "They work the ball so well. They just move the ball. They were phenomenal."

Rocky River scored two more goals in the second half and maintained most of the possession through the final whistle.

TIFFIN — When Lima Shawnee's Chloe Cleaves scored to tie Rocky River 1-1 two minutes into the second half, it appeared the Indians were poised to make a run at the Pirates.

But after tying the game it was the Pirates who upped their offensive game and recorded four goals in the final 20 minutes to secure a 5-1 win in the Division II regional final Saturday.

The loss ends Shawnee's season with a 16-2 mark. Rocky River (19-2) advances to the state semifinals Tuesday.

"It was great for Chloe to get that set piece and get the equalizer but Rocky River is a very technical team and it just proved to be too much for us the last 17 minutes of the game and they poured some in on us," Shawnee head coach Caroline O'Brien said. "It was a strong first half defensively. I thought we did a great job defensively and just had some breakdowns the last 17 minutes of the game.

The five goals given up were the most the Indians had given up to an opponent this year and prior to this game Shawnee had given up three goals only twice this year. For the season, Shawnee had yielded a total of 11 goals.

In the first half, Shawnee's defense and goalie Kaelen Swallow held up against Rocky River's firepower until the 16:41 mark when the Pirates worked their way deep into Indian territory and Annika Mocho struck one past Swallow.

Shawnee had trouble putting together any type of serious offensive threat in the first half but at the onset of the second half began to build much better and that eventually led to Cleaves' score who, from the 30 yard line, arched one towards the Pirate goal that Rocky River keeper Caitlyn Rose got a hand on but could not stop.

Unlike Wednesday's game where the Indians' built on their momentum after scoring, Shawnee never seemed to find the right touch for another score.

Rocky River did and scored four times, twice by sophomore Ava Pratt and goals from Maeve Kelly and Kelly O' Toole.

For the game, the Pirates had 15 shots on goal and Shawnee had one.

Triumph in Tiffin! River ousts Shawnee to earn berth in final four



TIFFIN, Ohio -- With a second-half surge and another big performance by a deep set of scorers, Rocky River earned another playoff victory Saturday. The high-octane Pirates netted a 5-1 victory over Lima Shawnee to earn the DII Region 6 title -- the program's second straight -- and now the Raiders from River are bound for the [Buckeye State final four](#).

On a beautiful autumn afternoon at Frost-Kalnow Stadium, the Indians -- a team that hadn't suffered a loss since August -- scored an equalizing goal early in the second half. River had led, 1-0, through 40 minutes but found itself knotted on the scoreboard despite owning a hefty edge in possession time and scoring chances. The Shawnee (18-2-1) goal was scored by Chloe Cleaves on a free kick in the 43rd minute. It would be the Indians' only shot on goal for the match.

It took Rocky River (19-2) nearly 25 minutes to respond, but when it did, the response was authoritative. And decisive.

Goals by Ava Patti and Maeve Kelly -- in the 68th and 69th minutes, respectively, vaulted the Pirates to a 3-1 lead. The final 11 minutes-and-change were a smooth-sailing defense of the program's 2020 region title.

While keeping a lid on things at their own end, the bracket-bolting Buccaneers got two more goals for good measure. A marvelous bit of long-distance tic-tac-toe in the 73rd-minute stands as emblematic for how unselfish, deep, and talented River's quick-strike offense truly is. On that play, Taylor Byall sent the ball from a wide flank to Kelly, who delivered a touch pass behind a Shawnee defender to an in-stride Mackenzie Russell, who finished for the goal.

It would be Patti closing out the game -- and a five-point afternoon -- when she went bar-down from 35 yards out in the 77th minute.

Five more playoff goals for a Rocky River squad which has now outscored foes, 38-3, in five bracket conquests. And Saturday's performance came against a Shawnee team that had only allowed 10 netfinders over its previous 20 games.

The triumph in Tiffin marked River's 12th in a row. If the Pirates can edge that streak to 14, it would be the ultimate statement for a team playing superb soccer at just the right time.

ON DECK: Rocky River will meet Chagrin Falls in a Tuesday evening state semifinal game. The Pirates and Tigers will clank swords and exchange cannon fire at 6 p.m. at Pat Catan Stadium in Strongsville.

DOUBLE-R REGIONAL REVELRY: Saturday's win marked Rocky River's third region title. River also won region crowns in 2013 -- when the Pirates won a state championship -- and 2020. The Pirates bowed out in a 4-2 semifinal loss last fall. ... The Double-R is 12-2 over its last 14 playoff games. Since 2010, the Pirates are 40-10 (.800) in postseason play.

NET GAINS: Sophia Murray scored the first goal of Saturday's match. Murray has now scored 14 goals and 41 points this season. The speedy senior has scored 98 points in her Rocky River career. Her 2-point Saturday leapfrogged her past current assistant coach McKenna Klodnick (96 points from 2010-13) for ninth place on the program's all-time points list. In her career, Murray has tallied 38 goals and 22 assists. ... Maeve Kelly's goal marked her team-leading 20th of the season. Kelly has now scored 13 points in the playoffs. ... Ava Patti has scored 19 points in the playoffs. Her Saturday goals marked the 40th and 41st of her career, but she's still not Pirates' all-time leading goal scorer with that last name. Sister Maya Patti registered 43 goals from 2017-20.

On the surface, it seems like a premise that could swing in the wrong direction right off the bat.

Take two juniors, a sophomore and a freshman in the back four, put a converted All-Ohio attacker at goalkeeper and see how it goes in the defensive third.

There are few sides with which that premise may work marginally, let alone well.

Then again, few sides are the Chagrin Falls girls.

The Tigers return to the Division II state final four for the seventh time in program history Nov. 9 — the lone News-Herald coverage area boys or girls side remaining in the postseason — with a D-II state semifinal at Strongsville, facing another formidable challenge in Rocky River.

How the side has settled in defensively amid Chagrin's traditionally rigorous schedule has been a big reason why.

"Those four are a machine," Tigers co-coach Pamela Malone said of her backline. "We nickname them 'The Wall' — they do really well. They double when they need to. They clear the ball out with purpose when they need to.

"They have held some of the best offensive players in Northeast Ohio to maybe one or two shots only. ... That whole sequence of games has just made them stronger and stronger as we have gotten farther into the season."

With junior Kate Bartlett and freshman Maggie Goss at center back, junior Oakleigh Niethammer and sophomore Maggie Oliver as the outside backs and Peyton Gellin in goal, the side has settled into a nice groove.

Bartlett has developed into a commanding center back with set-piece danger, another in a long line from the program, highlighted in recent memory by 2019 News-Herald girls soccer player of the year Katie Schumacher, [who is now playing at Western Michigan](#).

"Her growth has been great," Tigers co-coach Joe Ciuni said of Bartlett. "She had a really good freshman year, and last year was disjointed because of the pandemic. There were various reasons for that. I think she had to keep missing some time last year. This year, she has been playing throughout the whole season.

"She's at center back now, and we kind of had to rework our defense, and she has really stepped up. She is super calm on the ball, can use both feet easily. She just brings a different presence back there for us."

Chagrin has conceded 21 goals in 21 matches this season, with six clean sheets. Those shutouts include D-III elite-eight side and 2020 D-III state champion Kirtland and D-I state final four side Walsh Jesuit, the latter a signature 1-0 win on the final Saturday of the regular season.

"That definitely boosted our confidence," Tigers junior striker Elana McGinnis said. "It made us super, super excited and very, very confident. Obviously Walsh is a very, very, very good team. But the fact that we beat them just boosted our confidence."

The Tigers' 2-1 regional semifinal victory in extra time over fellow News-Herald coverage area power Kenston, handing the Bombers their first loss of 2021, was a statement of intent. It marked only the second time in 20 matches that potent Kenston has been held to one goal, and the one goal wasn't in the natural flow of attack. Instead, it was a late equalizer in regulation on a free kick by Paige Spicuzza.

Oliver drew plaudits for her work in limiting space consistently for Bombers standout freshman striker Lilah Cornell, and Bartlett had a goalline clearance off a set piece in regulation.

"We have been working for it all season," Bartlett said. "Our coaches have really just shaped us and told us what to do and how to defend and how to keep our composure when the games get intense. And I'm just so proud of our backline."

The 7-1 D-II regional final rout of a highly capable West Geauga side Nov. 6 was also impressive in its own way. The attack was dynamic, as Chagrin built a 4-0 lead by the 15th minute, but the Wolverines were not lacking in attacking quality in their own right with 10 shots on target.

The Tigers did well in, to some extent, suppressing angles and corner-turn potential for West G's dynamic junior striker Frankee Flesher.

"I love our backline," Chagrin senior attacking staple Sarah Burgess said. "They're really aggressive. Our outside backs, mostly younger kids in the back, and they really hold their own."

While Gellin does have goalkeeper experience on the club side, she never played it previously during high school season with Chagrin already having one of this area's best performers at the position in Aerin Krebs in recent years.

Instead, Gellin was an All-Ohio caliber midfielder, with 20 goals and five assists as a sophomore and 20 goals and 12 assists as a junior as the side went 31-7-2 over those two seasons.

With Krebs graduated, Gellin was called upon for goalkeeper duty and has flourished in the role, drawing high plaudits from Malone, who has had her share of great goalkeeping throughout her legendary career on the touchline.

"Well, I think every game we have gotten better," Malone said. "We have gotten more resourceful with each player."

"Peyton is huge in the goal. She is probably the top goalie in the state, if not the region. That keeps us in games."

Another tall order awaits for this new-look defensive-third group at Strongsville.

River has shown signs all fall of being a legitimate D-II state championship contender, of course confirmed now by being in the final four as it seeks its first state title since 2013 and second overall.

The Pirates, who dealt the Tigers a 2-0 loss Sept. 27, are 19-2 and have six players who have scored at least 11 goals, paced by Maeve Kelly (20-9), Sophia Murray (14-13), Ava Patti (13-10) and Sophia Sindelar (14-7).

That's quite a challenge, but that original premise has worked pretty well to this point.

"My backline are my favorite people," Gellin said. "They save my butt on the daily. They work so, so hard, and I'm so happy to have them on the backline.

"I'm so looking forward (to the final four). We've been there before, and we're hoping for a different outcome this time."

The Tigers (17-3-2) will play for the D-II state championship, eyeing their first title since the program's vaunted 1996 side, at 1 p.m. Nov. 12 against Cincinnati Wyoming, a 1-0 winner over Columbus Bexley. The match time was originally slated for 4 p.m. as of Nov. 9, but was changed the morning of Nov. 10 to the earlier start.

"Well, Joe had nicknamed this the revenge tour," Malone said. "Because we had tied Kenston. We had tied West G. And our lone D-II loss was to Rocky River. And so, to take care of those three teams, when we thought we should have done it the first time, it's just awesome. And that's what motivated us."

It felt like, with the Pirates' potency, it was going to require sturdiness in the back from the Tigers and a timely counter.

Both facets came for this gutsy side when it mattered most.

In the 68th, Elana McGinnis, who had netted a brace in the opening 40, got a touch on a quick counter and drew contact in the box.

Enter Bartlett, Chagrin's standout center back, for the biggest kick of her life to date by any reasonable measure.

The junior delivered from the spot, and the Tigers handled a spot of utter chaos from there seeing out a result with composure.

"I walked up, and Sarah Burgess walked up to me," Bartlett said. "She looked at me, and she was like, 'Kate, you've got this. You're going to hit it, and it's going to go in.' I stepped up there, and I had the confidence. I had the attitude, and it went in."

"It feels completely different. When you're in practice, obviously you take it seriously. But when you get out there on that field and it's 2-2 — and this is the game-winning goal to go to state — the pressure is just so much higher. The expectation is that you hit it like you would in practice. And that's what I tried to do."

Then in the 18th, Sarah Burgess collected a throw-in and played lovely skip service for McGinnis, who chested the subsequent touch into the back of the net for her 30th goal of 2021.

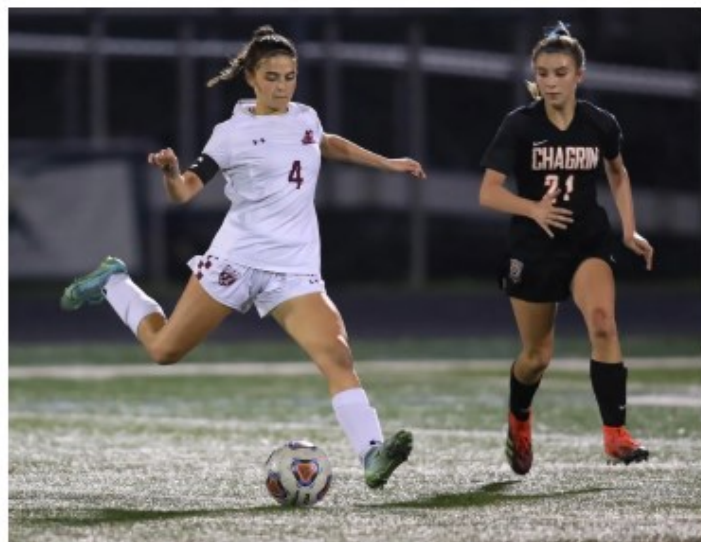
Chagrin was on the business end of a 6-2 shots on target margin in River's favor. Both shots were goals.

In tight traffic 1v1, Patti played a small but vital inside touch for space and took care of a right-footed finish, her 15th goal of the fall, and just like that, it was 2-2.

River enjoyed an 11-5 shots on target advantage for the match. But Tigers goalkeeper Peyton Gellin (nine saves) and her back four stood firm amid a barrage of offensive-third quality.

"Well obviously, they have a dominating midfield, and those girls are terrific," Bartlett said. "(Patti) is a special player. We just did our best to contain them, not dive in and push them one way. We always defend in twos, and I think we did that pretty well."

In the 59th, Burgess initiated a counter, playing through Alex Chinnici for Lindsay Burgess on a switch. The sophomore was turned away, but it yielded hope the right counter build could do the trick.

McGinnis, then Bartlett, confirmed that belief.

At the full-time whistle, the Chagrin student section, which was out in droves and to its credit did its part to create a raucous atmosphere, rushed the pitch to celebrate with its side, just as it did for a D-II regional semifinal win over Kenston in extra time at Ravenna.

As the congregation began to slowly unravel, but still overwhelmed with joy, Ciuni took a moment between celebratory handshakes from parents and fans, looked out with a wry grin and shook his head.

Bartlett gazed out over the remaining Chagrin faithful postmatch, savoring what the result meant and her part in it.

"No," Bartlett said when asked if the moment had sunk in yet. "Not at all."

Indeed, the revenge tour continues — all the way down Interstate 71.

Chagrin Falls topples Rocky River 3-2, advances to Division II girls soccer state title game on Friday

STRONGSVILLE, Ohio -- As the crowd gathered into Strongsville's Pat Catan Stadium Tuesday evening, you could feel the tension in the air.

Chagrin Falls' girls soccer team had already lost 2-0 to state semifinal opponent Rocky River back in September. But with an offense that generated two goals early in the first half, the Tigers carried the lead for most of the night and eventually used a penalty kick goal to claim a 3-2 victory and a spot in Friday's Division II state title game in Columbus.

The Tigers (18-3-2) had the best possible start against the Pirates (19-3) when junior forward Elana McGinness scored off a corner kick just over one minute into the game.

"We call it first blood. You know, from [the movie] Rambo," Tigers head coach Pamela Malone said. "We've scored first blood in all of our games except our loss to Avon, our loss to North Ridgeville and our loss to Rocky River. So it was really important that we got that first goal because then the other team's thinking 'well we have to have two goals in order to win,' but you can only score one goal at a time. It's just a great mental advantage to have scored first blood."

Second blood is an even bigger advantage. Which is what the Tigers exacted when senior midfielder Sarah Burgess crossed the ball in and McGinness connected for a second goal 18 minutes in.

That put Rocky River in scramble mode. Sophomore Ava Patti narrowed the deficit at the 27:21 mark with a shot from the top of the box. Trailing 2-1 to start the second half, Patti scored again on a step over at 49:26 to tie it up. Rocky River had all the momentum for the next 15 minutes, but couldn't grab the lead.

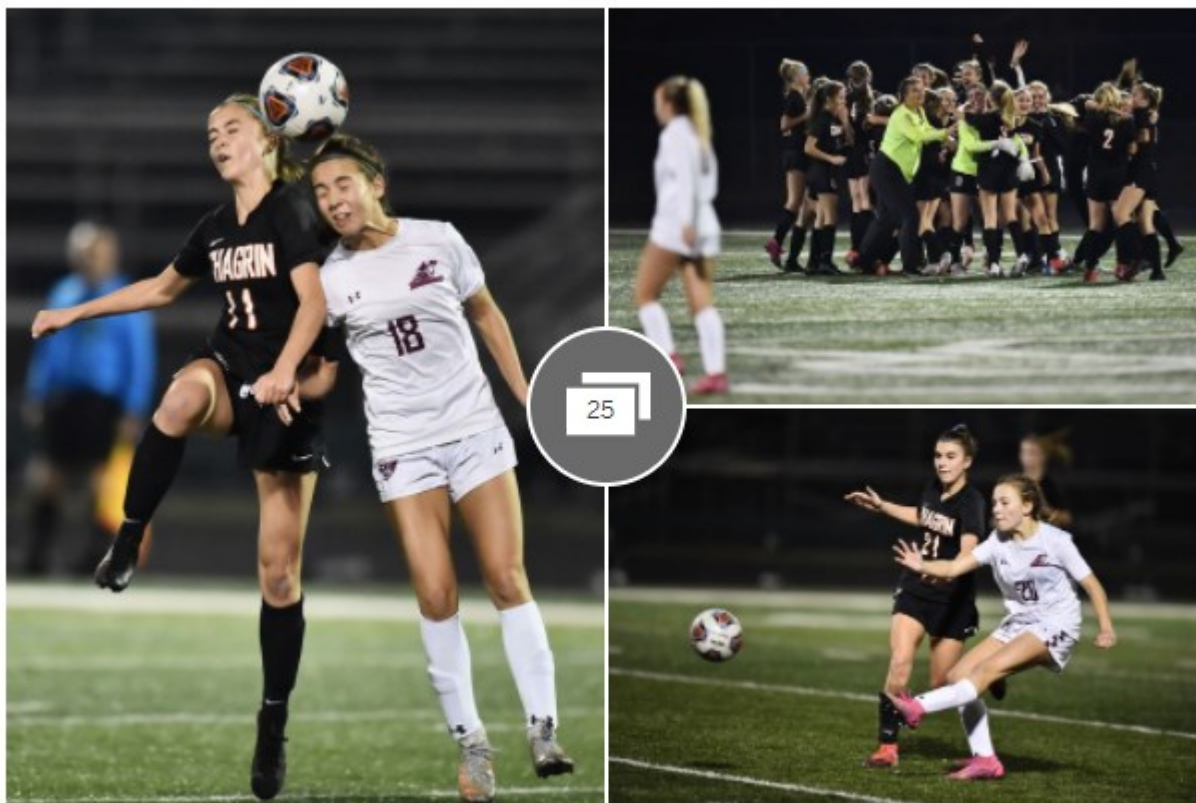
The Tigers finally rediscovered their aggressiveness, being rewarded with a penalty kick at 67:48. Junior midfielder Kate Bartlett stepped confidently into the box and buried it in the bottom right corner.

"No," Tigers assistant coach Joe Ciuni laughed about whether he would want anyone other than Bartlett taking the penalty. "No, because she said she thrives on the pressure of those PK spots, so she is our PK taker in games if we get that call during the flow of the game."

The Tigers run to the state final is made that much sweeter because of the teams they have had to go up against to get to this point.

“Joe had nicknamed this the revenge tour,” Malone said. “We had tied Kenston, we had tied West G and our lone D-II loss was to Rocky River. So to take care of those three teams when we thought we should have done it the first time is just awesome.”

Chagrin Falls will travel to Columbus' Lower.com Field to take on Cincinnati Wyoming, a 1-0 winner over Bexley Tuesday night, at 4 p.m. Friday for the Div. II championship.

"What we have done and the number of girls who have left this program and gone onto play in college and had success at the higher level and the success we have had over the years, truly impacts the girls that come in," Hopkins said. "We had two freshman starting tonight."

Patti added two goals tonight to her two goals and an assist from the regional final on Saturday.

"Ava did a great job finishing but Ava also wouldn't be as strong as she is without the people around her," Hopkins said.

Hopkins added "It's a phenomenal team and they played well today."

Even though the Pirates went down 2-0 early, they know the most dangerous lead in soccer is the 2-0 lead.

"The third goal usually wins the game and we know that. So that is what we focused on. We didn't focus on the 2-0," Hopkins said. "We focused on a 0-0 game and went after it and took it one goal at a time. At that point, we had to put the ball in the back of the net so we didn't focus on the score."

"We focused on scoring and getting back in the game and we did," Hopkins added. "Momentum switched and we applied a lot of pressure on them and we just didn't finish today."

The Pirates may have fallen short of the state final again, but the legacy that their seniors are leaving behind won't be forgotten anytime soon.

"They are going to leave this program with teaching the youth the high expectations," Hopkins said about the senior's legacy. "We are a team that we want more, we expect more and we demand more. Our expectations are high and we try to encourage each other to raise our expectations. A lot do people focus on the conference championship but we want districts, regionals and states. We want to raise the level and I believe we have. I think the seniors have really showed a great deal of how they can impact the underclassmen."
