Our goal is to engage each student in the career development process and help them progress through the decision-making process of selecting the appropriate path toward their career goals. While students work through the infinite possibilities of career choice and continuing education, our aim is to help them identify areas of interest and target their focus on what best suits them by providing feedback on their skills, interests, and options. Below is an overview of how students in RRCS gather information at all grades relative to their future plans. Our collective goal is each individual's development of self as that process will help lead them to future college and career readiness.

Goldwood Primary School (K-2) and Kensington Intermediate School (3-5)

Students participate in exploration activities to help them gain insight into their personal interests and abilities while giving them the opportunity to explore their interests. Students also discuss how to link their interests and coursework to future careers.

Rocky River Middle School (6-8)

Students are introduced to Naviance, a college and career readiness system used by RRCS to help coordinate and communicate efforts between school, student, and parent. Students are enrolled in a quarter-long class called "College and Career Readiness" (CCR) at each grade level where the teacher will cover a variety of topics and activities including the following tasks within Naviance listed below. Additionally, all 8th grade students will take the PSAT 8/9 in the Fall in order to practice for future standardized college admission tests.

Recommended College Admission Standardized Testing Schedule

October

Freshmen in Algebra I or Concepts of Algebra: PSAT 8/9

Freshmen in Honors/Geometry or Honors/Algebra II: PSAT

Sophomores: PSAT

Juniors: optional PSAT/NMSQT (\$20, recommended for all college-bound students)

December Junior Year: optional ACT for students planning to take College Credit + classes

February/March Junior Year: Free ACT offered at RRHS

February/March Junior Year: Free SAT (mandated by state) at RRHS

May/June Junior Year: optional re-take ACT, SAT, and/or SAT Subject Tests (only for high selective schools)

July/August/September/October Senior Year: optional re-take ACT and/or SAT
