Finance Committee

- Mr. Swartz reported that the Finance Committee met just prior to the Board of Education meeting.
 - Property tax receipts from the first scheduled advance for the month of January were significantly lower than expected due to the late receipt of property tax bills by some

taxpayers. However, this was made up in the February property tax advance amount.

• Salary expenditures were slightly higher than estimates due to additional maintenance and custodial time needed as a result of the severe weather. Benefit expenditures are trending slightly higher than estimated as well, but all other areas are either on target or below estimates at this point in the fiscal year.

School-Community Committee

- Ms. Goepfert reported that the Parks and Recreation Committee met on February 19th.
 - Program guides will no longer be mailed to homes. Program guides will be available in print at the Senior Center or can be found on the Parks and Recreation website.
 - Scuba lessons will be offered to children ages 8-11.
 - Summer volleyball will be offered to girls in grades 6, 7, and 8.
