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
Concerned about your child? Whatever the reason... Connecting for Kids can help.

Sensory Consults **A**

Does your child hate "itchy" clothes? Is your child bothered by noises or have difficulty with busy environments? Are you concerned about your child's frequent meltdowns and difficulty interacting with others? Does your child frequently spin, jump and crash his or her body into things? If so, come to our Sensory Consult where you and your child will meet with a pediatric occupational therapist. This consult is open to children ages 18 months-12 years. Your child will be encouraged to engage in some activities while you complete a checklist. You will also learn strategies to help him or her at home. This program is supported by Abilities First, LLC.
