
What is going on in: <u>Reading</u>

As we continue our tour of the world, we are on to our study of Asia! *Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes* by Eleanor Coerr is our novel. We are currently working in our LAP and should be finishing that up this week. You should know that this novel is set 10 years after World War II and we will be discussing the war and specifically Hiroshima. 
Our next novel will not be from our last continent, Antarctica, as there is very little children's literature being written there for us to study. I will be announcing our next book very soon.
