

What is going on in:
Reading: We spending time in North America right now. We have started our novel, The Secret School and are getting to know our characters Ida, Felix, Tom, and Herbert. As we work through this story we will be listening to music of the 1920's, witnessing the perfection of The Babe's swing, and learning about how the Bidson family's Model T was made. We may take a look at the cool clothes too!

Math? We will be working in Unit Three this week.
