

## What is going on in:



Reading? In reading this year we will travel from one continent to the next learning about cultures of the world through literature. We will be practicing our reading and writing skills along the way. First, we read as many folk tales, fairy tales, legends, and poems as we can find set in the continent. Next, we will read a novel that is set in or written by a native of the continent. We will finish the unit with a Language Activity Packet (LAP) where we will practice skills. We will be celebrating the differences and similarities of the cultures throughout our study as well.

Our first stop on our trip around the world is Europe. We will be reading the novel, The BFG, written by Roald Dahl. I encourage students to respond to vocabulary and concepts of a story as we read so we often write in our books as we go along. While it is not a requirement, I encourage each student to have a paperback copy of the book we are reading so that they may interact with the text directly. The $B F G$ should be easy to find in local book stores like Books-A-Million. If you have trouble finding a copy, please let me know and I can look around for you. We will be starting the novel around the week of September $12^{\text {th }}$.

Math? We are working on Unit one this week. Our topics will include analyzing and displaying data, equivalent names for numbers, and the language of chance events. (always, sometimes, never, will happen, might happen, will not happen). There is a new link on our web page: everydaymathonline.com. Your child has a login and password taped into his/her planbook cover. Take a moment to check out this site. There are wonderful resources to use if you get stuck on a homework assignment and the games are fun too.


Science? Our first unit will be the scientific method, science safety rules, science tools, and terms. This week we will be concentrating on the steps of the scientific method. How do we face a question like a scientist? What steps do we take in order to back up our hunches and ideas?

Social Studies? Our first unit in social studies is Maps and Geography. This week we will be learning about and creating a compass rose. Knowing about a compass rose will help us to move forward as we learn about maps and put them to use. Plus... the roses are pretty!

## Fundations?

Unit: Unit One, week one

* Concept: Closed Syllable (one vowel closed in by a consonant makes the vowel short. Ex. Up, box, fit, den, rat)

Trigraph $=$ three letters that make one sound (tch as in catch)
Digraph = two letters that make one sound (ch as in chin)
Blend= two or more letters grouped to make more than one sound ( bl as in blend)

* Words of the week: crunch and stretch
* Trick words: again and when
* Sound-Alikes: know/no, right/write
* Cursive letters: lower case $\mathbf{e}$ and $\mathbf{h}$.
