Grading practices continued...

The RRHS building goal for the 2018-2019 school year is to develop a recommendation for consistent grading and assessment practices across all content areas at Rocky River High School. Our secondary goal is to develop 100% common assessments across similar content areas that include common units, midterms and finals.

MAIN STORIES

During this process we will be looking at the correlation between students' grades compared to performance on state and national tests; how grades should be weighted; the value and purpose of homework; differentiated grading and assessing; depth of knowledge levels on assessments; and, how do we know grades are actually measuring content mastery rather than compliance?

Our midterms and finals policy is also new this year and is linked below. It sets the framework with how we will work to develop overall grading practices throughout the high school.
