RRMS Students Stop the Hate and Win \$10,000

Rocky River Middle School has been awarded a \$10,000 grant from the Maltz Museum of Jewish Heritage as part of the museum's annual Stop the Hate: Youth Speak Out essay contest. The annual contest is open to all students in grades 6-12 in seven area counties, including Cuyahoga. This year's theme was, "What would you do to fight discrimination?" Students were asked to reflect, in 500 words or less, about a time they witnessed an act of discrimination or hate, how they responded, and how they might change their response the next time. The top prize was a \$40,000 scholarship, up to \$10,000 per year for up to 4 years.

This year, the contest sponsors introduced three new prizes of \$10,000 each that were specifically for schools rather than students. Winners were the school with the grand-prize winning entry and one of the eight Cleveland Public schools chosen to participate in Stop the Hate: Youth Sing Out. The third new prize, and the one Rocky River Middle School won, was for having the highest percentage of student essays entered in the contest. Over 500 RRMS students entered.

Two RRMS students also submitted winning essays. Nolan Weaver took third place in the 7th grade category and Thomas Schill won first place in the 8th grade category. They received their prizes at the annual contest celebration, which was held on March 12. Ms. Jenny Doran, who is Nolan's English teacher, and Ms. Michelle Buttari, who teaches Thomas, accompanied their students to the celebration, as did principal Mrs. Megan Rose.

A New Playground for Goldwood



Any child can tell you: playing is serious business. At Rocky River's Goldwood Primary School, the grown-ups know it too. That's why a group of parents undertook a playground renovation for the school, with the support of the community.

A few years ago, parents started noticing that the playground at Goldwood, which serves pre-schoolers through second graders, was in need of a little sprucing up. Mom Deb DeCarlo met with Goldwood's Principal, Carol Rosiak, and posed the question: is the Goldwood playground ready for a facelift?

The principal agreed it was, and a committee was born. Parents Beth McBride, Erin Konet, and Liz Harmath are cochairs of the Playground Renovation Committee, and in February of 2013, committee representatives presented their idea to the Rocky River Board of Education. "Our plan was just to let them know what we wanted to do and why," Beth McBride recalls. "We did not expect any district funding. But the board said, 'we think this is a great idea and we want to partner with you.' They gave us the first donation towards the project. It was a huge surprise and a huge boost."

Shortly after that, the group was awarded a generous grant from the Rocky River Education Foundation. The Lakewood and Rocky River Rotary and the Rocky River Women's League pitched in too. The grassroots efforts to raise funds for a new playground involved sending out a brochure to detail the fund drive, complete with donation levels ranging up to naming rights for \$20,000.

The new playground will incorporate four existing structures (including the much-loved dinosaur!) and add nearly three dozen new play components, including 5 slides and a capacity for more than 110 children. The committee is especially pleased to note that no existing blacktop or green space will be sacrificed for the project.

The playground will be installed during the summer and a ribbon-cutting ceremony is scheduled for August 15, 2014 at 4 PM, rain or shine.

RR Education Foundation Funds Biggest Year Ever

The 2013-2014 school year is Rocky River Education Foundation's biggest year ever! Fall 2013 and Spring 2014 grant awards to teachers totaled over \$48,000.

Fall 2013 grant awards totaled over \$14,00 plus an additional \$10,000 donation to the new Goldwood playground.

The Spring 2014 grant awards include funding for:

- Math applications for iPads for Goldwood Primary School.
- New hardcover biographies for the Kensington Intermediate School library.
- Common Core math learning stations for use by third graders at KIS. RREF doubled the requested amount.
- Music enhancement for grades 3-5 at KIS to improve instruments for Beginning Band Night in the fall.
- Forty-five students from Rocky River Middle School to participate in the National History Day competition in March at the Western Reserve Historical Society. The group went on to take first place with its Japanese American exhibit and will move on in the competition.
- Multi-sensory teaching equipment at RRMS which includes exercise balls, headphones, and writing gel pads.
- Two ELMO projectors and magnifying lenses to project items onto SMART Boards for the RRMS science department.
- The expansion of the RRHS's choral music library.
- A partnership between the RRHS art and special education departments to bring in a professional artist and provide supplies for forty students to complete silk painting projects.

In addition to its grant program, RREF kicked off funding efforts for the Rocky River City Schools Speaker Series. Rocky River City Schools has been fortunate the past two years to have noted authors Loung Ung and James Swanson speak to the student body and the community as part of RRHS's summer reading program. RREF, which helped fund the substantial cost of having these speakers appear, recognized the impact such speakers had on our students and the larger community and wanted to help ensure that the school district would be able to continue to bring in quality speakers. As a result, RREF had a special fundraising effort at its annual auction and raised just under \$15,000 for the Speaker Series to bring authors/speakers annually to schools throughout the district. RREF will continue its own fundraising efforts and look to partner with other organizations to help bring in author/ speakers to one or more schools in the district each year.

Support for our students does not end at graduation. RREF works with a host of generous donors to administer scholarships to RRHS seniors. We are proud to announce that at the Spring Recognition Ceremony on May 22nd, over \$45,000 in 40 scholarships were awarded to the class of 2014.

With the generosity of the Rocky River community, local businesses, and RRCS's teachers, staff, and administration, Rocky River Education Foundation continues its mission to help enrich the educational experiences of our students.
