## For each chapter of F. Scott Fitzgerald's *The Great Gatsby*:

- Choose a short passage (no more than 30 lines) that you appreciate as meaningful to the work as a whole and relevant to the literary feature assigned for that chapter (setting, character, etc.). THERE ARE NINE CHAPTERS TOTAL. You are encouraged to color-mark, highlight, annotate, or otherwise make notes on the passage.
- Each passage should be used to HAND WRITE one INTEGRATED quote in the chart.
- Be sure your choices, thinking, and writing are your own. If your work too closely resembles that of another student, or if your work is not your own, it will be marked as missing and returned to you to be redone. Late penalties and other deductions will apply.
