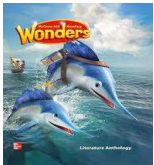
## A Note From Mrs. Fiorillo

## A Peek At What We Are Learning



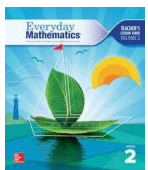
### Reading
