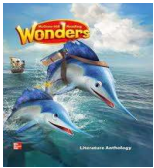

The Reading Log GOAL is to read 100 minutes during the week. 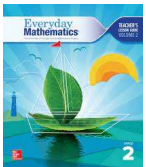
Reading
