






## RCSD Returns \$1.1 Million to Bond Fund

- 2010 Bond Issue had \$1.1 million earmarked for mandated All-Day Kindergarten classrooms
- State eliminated mandate for All-Day Kindergarten, so additional classrooms not needed
- In October 2017, Board of Education voted to repay \$1.1 million to bond retirement fund
- One-year reduction of property taxes in 2018 for homeowners of approx. \$44 per \$100,000 of property value










### Expenditures - All Funds - Fiscal Year 2017
